

## **Requirements for the application for Associate Professorship in Social, Cultural and Historical Anthropology at the Faculty of Humanities, Charles University.**

The procedure of granting the associate professorship at Charles University is described in the Code of Procedure for the Granting of Associate Professorship and Full Professorship: <https://cuni.cz/UKEN-649.html>.

### Discipline-specific requirements of the Faculty of Humanities

- Associate professorship dissertation: the candidate can choose to submit one of the following types of dissertation: 1 a monograph or 2. a collection of published scientific papers. As far as the collection of the published scientific papers is concerned, the requirements are as follows: a coherent and interrelated collection of a minimum of 6 scientific papers, where in at least half of the papers the candidate is the sole author, or in at least 80 per cent the applicant is the first author or a co- author with the share of at least 50 per cent. The collection must contain a summary preface. Please note that the papers included in this collection do not count in the minimum of publications required for the habilitation procedure.
- Publication activity in the field of the procedure must include at least 3 articles in journals maintained in the Web of Science database (Jimp) or 2 independent book monographs (B). For each study published in Q1 or Q2 according to WoS or for a scientific monograph in a foreign language published in a major foreign publishing house, the total number of publications required by Charles University will be reduced by one.
- A minimum of 20 citations is required for the habilitation procedure, of which at least 5 are foreign/international citations. Reviews can be included in the overview of citations, provided that they have been published in professional journals. The applicant must specify the methodology for citations search.
- The candidate demonstrates the ability of independent scientific research work by leading at least one scientific research project.
- an internship at a foreign scientific research institute for a minimum of 3 months (or a maximum of 3 internships for a total of 3 months) is required. The internship may be replaced by joint publications such as a foreign monograph or an article in Jimp with a foreign co-author, for which the applicant's share is at least 40%, while 2 such publications must be submitted for the habilitation procedure.
